4. working to the requirements of our accredited and certified quality systems;
5. selecting suppliers, partners, and sub-contractors, where possible, who share our commitment to continual improvement of products, services, and people;
6. providing our outputs in high-quality peer-reviewed publications, where possible; and taking advice from external experts on the Cefas Science Advisory Committee on science quality
